



Purpose:

1. Residency – All That Apply




2. Age




4. Georgetown Life How Important are These Features to You?




5. a. Changing Demographics – What Initiatives could the Town take to Increase School Enrollment? (184)

- Create More Affordable Housing (60)
- Attract Students Advertise School Strengths (academics, improve state test scores, quality, personalized, excellent teachers)
- Establish a Magnet or Charter School Outdoor Based Education Create Unique Programs (e.g. Marine/Ecology)
- Improve Internet enable telecommuting (10) "I for one would immediately consider moving to Georgetown year-round with my partner to build our family if I could work in my field from there (telecommute)".
- Increase Availability of Local Jobs (10)
- Establish Preschool Child Care
- Bring grades 7 & 8 back to Georgetown
- Invite Immigrant Families
- Negative (10) Recommend Closing the School if its not Economically Viable – "Town should not be attempting to fabricate ways to justify maintaining this expensive school to the benefit of a few"


5.b. What Changes in Town would make it Easier for Elders to Stay in their Homes Longer?





7. Land Use How Do You Feel about the Current Level of Commercial Land Use?




8. Marine Resources How do You Utilize Marine Resources in Georgetown?




8. b. Marine Resources – Future Impact (196)

- Climate Change Global Warming, Ocean Warming, Sea Level Increase, Increased Storm Activity/Damage, Destruction of Salt Marshes, Water Acidity
- Access to the Waterfront Moorings, Fees
- Depletion of Some Fish Stocks Overfishing, Climate Changes,
 Government Restrictions, Urchins, Shrimp,
- Invasive Species Green Crabs, Plankton, Ribbon Worms
- Too Many Aquaculture Farms in Robinhood Cove
- Pollution Trash, Human Waste, OBDs, Outhouses, Animal Waste, Plastics, Fertilizers, Pesticides
- Increasing Property Taxes Especially on Ocean Front Land Fishermen Unable to Afford Living in Georgetown
- Rich People from away Buying Up Waterfront, Too Much Construction,
 Cutting Down Too Many Trees
- Town Dock (Wharf) originally Purchased by Town Fundraising and Grant for Commercial Fishermen's Use


9.a. Housing Which Future Housing Alternatives do You think the Town Should Encourage?




9.b. Which of the Following Opportunities for More Affordable Housing in Georgetown Would You Prefer?



10. Infrastructure How Well do Georgetown's Infrastructure and Municipal Services Meet Your Needs?




11.a. Internet Communications in Georgetown Which Use of the Internet is Most Important to You?


11.b. Internet Communications in Georgetown What Devices do You Use to Connect to the Internet?


How Important are the Following Assets and Facilities to the Town?

- Concern about the Lack of Young People/Families in Town

17. What do you like least about living in Georgetown? (224)

- Environmental Factors and Nuisances mosquitoes, ticks, black flies, brown tail moth caterpillars and snow/winters
- Travel Distance and Time to obtain Goods, Services or Employment shopping, medical appointments, recreation, work or services
- Traffic and Unsafe Roadways, Especially for Pedestrians and Cyclists -Summer traffic - Lack of safe/adequate road shoulders
- Tension among Various People in the Community "Newcomers" and "Long-Time" residents - Seasonal and Year-Round residents - Different Points of View
- Inadequate Internet, Cell Telephone and Television Service
