Building a Home Disaster Supply Kit (Source: Ready.gov)

- 3-day supply of nonperishable food that does not require cooking
- 3-day supply of water (1 gallon of water per person, per day)
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- First aid kit

- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps

What to include in a home First Aid Kit (Source: American Red Cross)

- 2 absorbent compress dressings (5 x 9 inches)
- 25 adhesive bandages (assorted sizes)
- 1 adhesive cloth tape (10 yards x 1 inch)
- 5 antibiotic ointment packets (approximately 1 gram)
- 5 antiseptic wipe packets

- 2 packets of aspirin (81 mg each)
- 1 emergency blanket
- 1 breathing barrier (with one-way valve)
- 1 instant cold compress
- 2 pair of non-latex gloves (size: large)

- 2 hydrocortisone ointment packets (approximately 1 gram each)
- 1 3 in. gauze roll (roller) bandage
- 1 roller bandage (4 inches wide)
- 5 3 in. x 3 in. sterile gauze pads

- 5 sterile gauze pads (4 x 4 inches)
- Oral thermometer (non-mercury/non-glass)
- 2 triangular bandages
- Tweezers
- Emergency First Aid guide

Additional Emergency Supplies (Source: Ready.gov)

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies,
- Identification and bank account records in a waterproof, portable container
- Cash and credit cards
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Complete change of clothing
- Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper –
 When diluted 9 parts water to 1-part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant.

- In an emergency, you can treat water by adding 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners.
- Fire extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates and plastic utensils, paper towels
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

POWER OUTAGES

- Keep the following items on hand to prepare for a power outage lasting longer than two hours:
 - One or more coolers and ice to preserve food (inexpensive Styrofoam coolers work well)
 - o Digital quick response thermometer to check food temps for safe use
 - Flashlight and batteries (Do not use candles during a power outage due to the extreme risk of fire).
- If you have an emergency generator:
 - o Place generators outdoors in the fresh air
 - o Ensure the generator is at least 15 feet away from home windows or doors
 - Make a plan for how to keep your generator dry and protected from ice and snow so you are not tempted to bring it inside a garage or other enclosed structure.
 - Generators also pose a risk of shock and electrocution, especially in wet conditions. Dry your hands before touching a generator.
